REGIONAL COMPETITION for YOUNG ORGANISTS (RCYO)

This competition, held in odd-numbered years, is sponsored and administered by the nine regions of the American Guild of Organists. Competitors must be under 23 years of age as of August 1 of the year the competition is held. Membership in the AGO is not required. The first round of competition begins at the chapter level. Competitors may compete in any chapter competition held within the AGO region of their home or school. Only one chapter competition may be entered. Registration fee is required for chapter level. The final round is held concurrent with the [Regional Conventions](#). Required repertoire is published with the official rules in [THE AMERICAN ORGANIST](#).

A Message from the Sub-Dean ~ Jeffrey Harbin

Your Atlanta Chapter Executive Committee has been busy planning many exciting programs for the **2009-2010 season!** Here is a preview of what's in store:

The new season will begin on Tuesday evening, **September 8** with a recital by Ben van Oosten at the Roman Catholic Cathedral of Christ the King in Buckhead featuring works by Handel, Bach, Mendelssohn, Guilmant, Saint-Saëns and Vierne. The cathedral houses a three manual, 67 rank organ completed by Gouling & Wood in 1992.

Mr. van Oosten has become one of the greatest practitioners and interpreters of organ works from the French Romantic school of the 19th Century. Among his recordings are the complete works of [Charles-Marie Widor](#), the complete works of [Louis Vierne](#), the eight sonatas of [Alexandre Guilmant](#) and the organ works of [Jacques-Nicolas Lemmens](#) and [Louis James Alfred Lefébure-Wély](#). He has also undertaken a recording of the complete works of [Marcel Dupré](#). In 1998, the French government awarded him the honorary rank of [Chevalier dans l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres](#) for his efforts in reviving the French Romantic tradition. Besides maintaining a heavy recital schedule and an active private teaching practice, he serves as organist for Grote Kerk (Hague) and is a Professor of Music at [Rotterdam Conservatory](#) in the Netherlands. He has also written a biography of Widor and his works, *Vater der Orgelsymphonie*.

On Tuesday evening, **October 13**, All Saints Episcopal Church has invited us to be their guests as they present "*Buzard on Buzard*." Talented young artist Stephen Buzard will perform on the four manual, 87 rank organ built by his father, John-Paul. Stephen is currently a student of Ken Cowan at Westminster Choir College.

Mark your calendars now for Saturday, **April 10**, 2010, the date of our post-Easter celebration in the mountains of North Georgia! Piedmont College will be sending a bus to Atlanta to shuttle chapter members to hear the three manual, 67 rank mechanical action Casavant organ installed in the school's chapel in 2002. Chapter members will also have the opportunity to hear and play the lovely three rank mechanical action practice organ built by our very own Phil Parkey for neighboring Brooks Hall in 2005. On that same day, we will also have the rare privilege to hear a recital on the oldest church organ in the state of Georgia, a Henry Erben commissioned in 1848 by Grace-Calvary Episcopal Church in nearby Clarkesville. Lunch will be served on the college campus between the two programs.

This is just the "tip of the iceberg!" Plans are also being finalized for two more organ recitals, a music sharing session, a student recital and our annual end of the year Guild Service/Hymn Festival. Several more *special* guests have been invited to lead us in these programs - you will not be disappointed! Look for details on these events in your yearbook and in future issues of the *Organizer*.

AGO MEMBERSHIP ENJOYS NEW GROWTH

18,409 Individuals Renewed Membership or Joined the American Guild of Organists During the 2008–2009 Membership Year

The American Guild of Organists (AGO), the largest organization in the world dedicated to organ and choral music, is pleased to announce the first increase in membership in more than a decade, as reported by AGO Executive Director James Thomashower. At the close of the 2008–2009 membership year, AGO membership totaled 18,409 voting members, an increase of 167 over the 2007–2008 membership year. "Independent Membership is our fastest growing category," declared Thomashower, "while chapter membership remains our largest and most vital membership segment."

AGO Director of Membership and Administration, Jennifer Madden noted that the membership increase resulted from three initiatives: a chapter-based phonathon designed to renew lapsed members; a solicitation to lapsed members prepared by AGO National Headquarters; and restricting access to portions of the AGO Web site to members only. "Because of this three-phased approach, we had a surge in renewals and new independent memberships, ending the year with over 700 Independent Members." While Independent Members have no local chapter affiliation and receive no local chapter benefits, they receive all other voting membership benefits and privileges.

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Founded in 1896, the American Guild of Organists has more than 300 local chapters throughout the United States and abroad. The Independent Membership category was created in 2003 in response to individuals living in remote geographic areas not otherwise served by a local AGO chapter. Although independent members have no chapter affiliation, they are served by their district convener, regional coordinators for education and professional development, and their regional Councillor. Independent members receive full membership benefits, including eligibility for all health and insurance plans offered through the AGO, national election voting privileges, a subscription to The American Organist Magazine, and discounts on AGO convention registration fees and education resources from the AGO Bookstore. "While Independent Membership is available to all, even to those living where a local chapter exists, it is the AGO's hope that individuals joining the Guild for the first time as independent members will soon discover the many additional benefits and programs available through chapter affiliation, and will choose to join their local chapter, if one exists, at the

time of membership renewal," noted Herbert Buffington, director of the AGO Committee on Membership Development and Chapter Support.

AGO membership is open to all and includes working professionals—organists, choir directors, teachers, organbuilders, technicians, and suppliers to the field — as well as students, clergy, amateur musicians, and dedicated supporters.
