Francis Kline (born Joseph Paul Kline III) entered the Trappist monastery of Our Lady of Gethsemani in Kentucky after completing a degree at the Juilliard School. He studied theology in Rome at the Benedictine Athenaeum, Sant' Anselmo, earning an STB in 1984. In 1986, he was ordained priest and appointed Novice Director. In 1990, he was elected third Abbot of Mepkin Abbey.

Abbot Francis gives retreats for monasteries, and lectures and conferences for seminaries and parishes, as his cloistered life-style permits. He has published

articles on patristic subjects, the theology of St. Bernard, Liturgy and spirituality. His book, *Lovers of the Place: Monasticism Loose in the Church*, is published by The Liturgical Press. Fr. Francis also serves on the boards of several foundations, institutes and seminaries.

Joseph Kline played his first organ recital at age 15. He studied with Alexander McCurdy of the Curtis Institute and with Vernon deTar at the Juilliard School. During his last year at Juilliard, he played the complete organ works of J. S. Bach in fourteen recitals in two halls of the school, as well as at the Church of the Ascension and St. Michael's Church. The *Christian Science Monitor* took notice of this *Bach Year* in an editorial and the *New York Times* ran a feature article on the twenty-one year old. He repeated the Bach cycle the next year at St. Mark's Church in Philadelphia. Each of the thirteen recitals was recorded by Columbia Records the night before the performance. These concerts are still heard on radio. Mr. Kline has played recitals in many churches of New York City. He has been featured on the Voice of America and as soloist at the Academy of Music in Philadelphia.

His professional musical career came to an abrupt halt in 1972 when he entered the Trappist monastery of Gethsemani, where he took the name of Francis. As a young monk, Brother

Francis received permission to take up music again and integrate it into his monastic life. He now plays a limited number of recitals. In 1984 he was the featured recitalist at the *Stage des jeunes organistes* at the Cathedral of Luçon (France), the home of the great Cavallé-Coll organ of 1852, and returned to Luçon in 1990 and in 1993. He gives annual recitals at the St. Luke's Chapel in Charleston.

His Piccolo Spoleto Festival engagements have featured all-Bach recitals (1992 and 1995), a concert featuring Marcel Dupré's *Le chemin de la croix* (1997), Olivier Messiaen's *Quatuor pour la fin du temps* (1998) with the St. Petersburg String Quartet, and the Charleston premier of his four *Thérèse of Lisieux* concert arias (1998). He served as co-coordinator for the 1998 *L'Organo Piccolo Spoleto* concert series. His most recent compositions include the *Exultet* (1998), *Mass in Honor of Thérèse of Lisieux* (1997), *The Cooper River Mass* (1996), and *Lamento* (1993) a piece for solo organ. Of a recent Bach recital in France, Abel Gaborit wrote in *Harmoniques*:

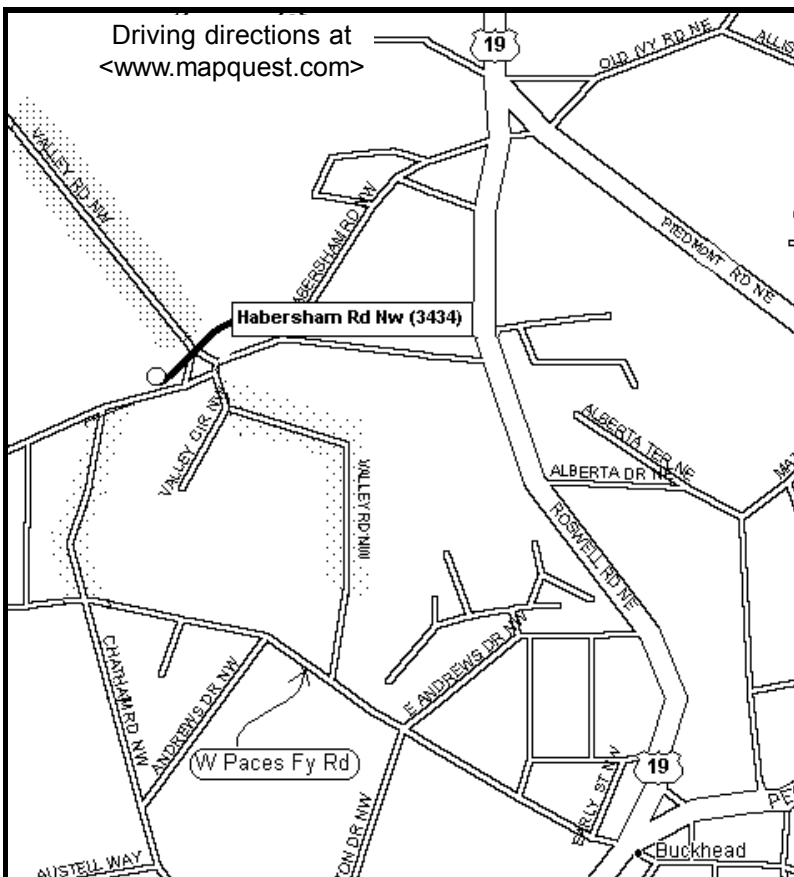

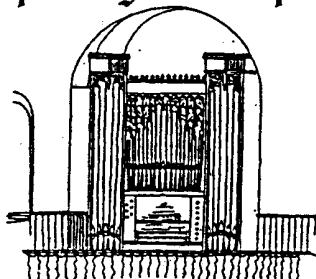
