The October program for the Atlanta Chapter AGO will be a 40th birthday celebration for the lovely Flentrop organ at St. Anne's Episcopal Church. Installed during the tenure of organist William (Bill) Weaver. This was the first Flentrop instrument in the area (the second was the house organ which Bill and Doug Johnson installed in their home!). This very festive occasion is being underwritten by Bill and Doug, and the Chapter appreciates so very much their generosity, now, and over the years.

Please note that the program will be on **Monday** night this month, and that the dinner will be hosted by Trinity Presbyterian Church, which is across the street from St. Anne's Church. The recital will be delayed 15 minutes to give members a little extra time to travel!

The featured recitalist for the evening will be *Dr. Stephen Hamilton*, Minister of Music at the historic Church of the Holy Trinity in New York City. In addition to his duties at Holy Trinity, Dr. Hamilton is a member of the artist faculties at Hunter, Mannes and Queens Colleges, and is in demand as a clinician for master classes and workshops across the country. As a recitalist, he has performed around the world to critical acclaim. Dr. Hamilton, who earned his doctorate at the Manhattan School of Music, was Dean of the New York City Chapter, AGO, from 1998-2004, and is program chairman of the Region II AGO convention scheduled in New York for July, 2007.



A Message from The DEAN

For someone who prides himself on language and the power of words, I find myself at a loss for an adequate way to thank Sue Goddard, Dr. John Beyers, and the staff at Grace United Methodist Church for the delightful gift they gave us in September. Ever since our opening program for the new season, the one song I've been singing to myself is "Amazing Grace!"

From the pyramid of punch glasses during the "social hour" to the last note of Wagner's "Ride of the Valkyries" it was an evening to remember! (It would be interesting to know how many notes Frederick Hohman played in his incredible program of organ pieces and orchestral transcriptions!) On my eighth grade piano recital, my friend Donna O'Neal and I played a four-hand arrangement of von Suppe's "Poet and Peasant Overture" – every note and nuance came back to me as I listened to it again. And how much more we enjoyed the dinner with Greg Colson's improvisations at the piano!

It was a wonderful opportunity to share in the celebration of Sue's fiftieth anniversary at Grace. To serve a congregation so faithfully, and to be nurtured by a congregation so thoroughly is indeed something to be celebrated. The spectacular renovation of the sanctuary at Grace, both visually and acoustically, and the 101 ranks sounding literally from the four corners of the space attest to the high esteem which music (read "Sue Goddard") holds in the worship life, and in the hearts, of that congregation.

My hope is that we can keep that thread of enthusiasm running through the entire season, so that when we come to the time to host the Regional Convention in June, we can demonstrate to the rest of the region what hospitality, congeniality, and collegiality are all about.

Many of you will recall last year when we announced with sadness the death of our oldest Chapter member, Mrs. Elizabeth Taylor. In her memory and from her estate, the Atlanta Chapter has been generously given a scholarship endowment of \$300,000. This gift will enable us to provide substantial support for deserving young organists for many years to come. Mrs. Taylor's nephew, the Rev. William Yon, Bishop Bevel Jones, and John Robinson, the attorney for her estate, joined us for dinner, reminisced about Mrs. Taylor's role in the Atlanta music community, and presented the check to the Chapter.

Everything is rapidly falling into place for our Regional Convention next June. Contracts have been sent to performers, venues for programs are being confirmed, and committees are rapidly tying up the loose ends to ensure the best convention possible. The success of such an undertaking depends on the willingness of all of the "hosts" to do their part. Many of you are already working on one of the facets of the convention; others will be called as new jobs emerge, and I encourage you to say "yes" when asked to help. Bruce Neswick and John Brandt, co-chairs of the convention, have given so generously of their time and energy to lay the groundwork for a grand event.

The revised Mission Statement of the Guild is included on the cover of this newsletter and in the Chapter Yearbook:

"To promote the organ in its historic and evolving roles, to encourage excellence in the performance of organ and choral music, and to provide a forum for mutual support, inspiration, education, and certification of Guild members."

We're off to a great start in living up to this ideal – let's keep it going!




