In my opinion, 2010-2011 has been an exceptional season for the Atlanta Chapter. We've enjoyed three stellar performances by distinguished concert organists Wilma Jensen, Cherry Rhodes and Douglas Cleveland. We've had opportunities to learn from several of our gifted colleagues in the areas of organ improvisation, music history and handbells. Several folks are now preparing for Guild exams; one of our members, Jill Hudson, was recently granted Service Playing certification. In December, many of us enjoyed a time of fellowship and holiday cheer at the Christmas Party. We've done quite a bit to encourage our "up-and-coming" organists this year with a *Pedals, Pipes and Pizza* event in January, the Student Recital in February and the Quimby/Regional Competition for Young Organists in March. The annual chapter Scholarship Auditions are just around the corner.

Our year is sure to end on a high note with the annual Guild Service at St. Bartholomew's Episcopal Church on Sunday evening, May 15. We will be inspired by beautiful music from the church's outstanding choir led by Organist and Choirmaster Brad Hughley. We will once again be strengthened and encouraged by a homily from our chapter Chaplain, the Rev. Dr. John Beyers. We will also elect two new "members-at-large" to the Executive Committee for a three-year term. I can't imagine a better slate of candidates than what has been presented by our Nominating Committee. If for some reason you are unable to attend the meeting, an absentee ballot appears elsewhere in this newsletter.

May will also feature the long-awaited return of the Used Music Sale. Bill Callaway has graciously agreed to head up this project for our chapter. Proceeds will be used to help fund the commissioning of new works for organ and choir. Joanne Brown and her committee are busy working on a commission to be premiered at our Guild Service in May, 2012.

Speaking of next season, Sub-Dean Tim Young has an excellent line-up planned for 2011-2012. We will have programs at some of our favorite venues, return to some that we haven't visited in several years and visit others for the first time. I don't want to give away too much - stay tuned for details!

A highlight of next season will be the first Taylor Organ Competition which will take place on Saturday, April 21, 2012 at St. Luke's Episcopal Church. This competition was made possible due to the generosity of Elizabeth Abbot Taylor, a long-time member of the Atlanta Chapter. If you haven't done so already, visit taylororgancompetition.com and learn more about what promises to be a milestone in the history of our chapter. My thanks goes out to the competition committee for the many hours of hard work they've already put in to make this event a success.

I hope that many of you will attend the Region IV Convention which will be held in Greensboro, North Carolina on June 26-29. Best wishes to all for a restful and rejuvenating summer!

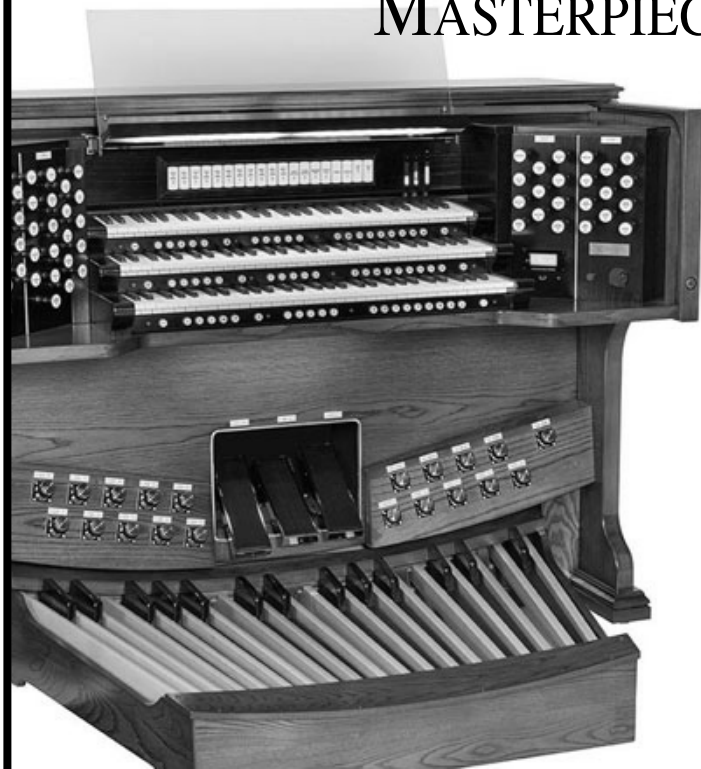

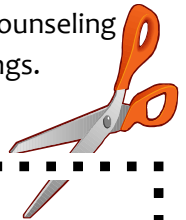

Mellichamp Celebrates Forty Years at the Organ

Dr. James Mellichamp, Provost of Piedmont College in Demorest, Georgia, recently presented his fortieth concert career anniversary recital on Sunday afternoon in Piedmont's acoustically perfect chapel playing on their magnificent Casavant organ.

Dr. Mellichamp, an internationally acclaimed concert artist chose for his program a varied and challenging repertoire. The wide spectrum of compositions included works by Bruhns, Bach, Schumann, Messiaen, and Durufle'.

Mellichamp's brilliant technique served him well in these most demanding organ works. His sensitive registrations and stylistic approach were evident to a most appreciative group of listeners.

The packed house was at times mesmerized by his beautiful playing. This was obvious by the complete silence which they kept during the performance but at the end of the pieces were wildly enthusiastic with their applause.

Several times during the recital Dr. Mellichamp addressed the audience describing some interesting elements of the works. He also paid some heartfelt tributes to some of the teachers and mentors who had helped him along the way. One of the most lauded was his legendary teacher Wilma Jensen.

This recital was an event which will long be remembered by all the organ aficionados who came. It included most of the area's professional musicians as well as several nationally recognized artists.

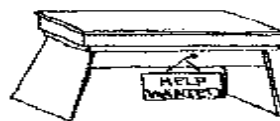

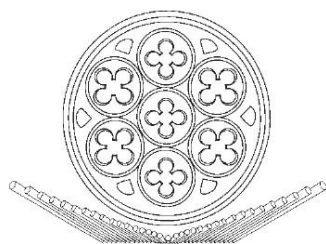

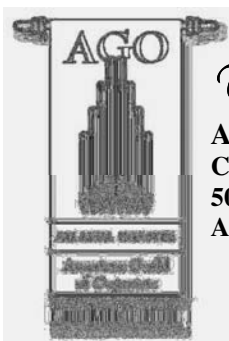
