Richard Ezell

Richard Ezell, husband of AGO member Michael Morgan, passed away last week and was interred next to his parents in Arkansas. Richard joined Central Presbyterian Church in 1990 and went on to found the Geneva Bell Choir, which he continued to support in the role of ringer and as interim director several times. A beloved member of the Down Yonder parish, Richard provided his rich bass voice and gentle humor to Chancel Choir rehearsals for two decades. Professionally, he spent most of his career as a computer programmer and analyst at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Richard is survived by his husband, Central Presbyterian's Organist Emeritus Michael Morgan, his son and daughter-in-law Chris and Penny Ezell, his daughter and son-in-law Stephania and Chuck Abell, and four grandchildren. A service in witness to the resurrection will be held at Central Presbyterian after the church reopens to in-person worship, or is able to have the service that Michael wants in a safe manner.

Marilyn Schmeh Munson (1942-2021)

Marilyn Schmeh Munson, a lifelong pianist and church organist who loved traveling with her husband, Greg, served as the family ambassador on trips abroad, and enjoyed eating dessert first, died Thursday, March 25, 2021, in Canton, Georgia. She was 78.

Born in Brooklyn to Berta and Alfons Schmeh, who had immigrated from Southern Germany in 1929, Marilyn at age nine months moved with her family to Valley Stream, Long Island.

Marilyn started taking piano lessons on her fourth birthday, studied under renowned pedagogists and concert pianists and served as a church organist and often choir director at churches in Long Island and Hendersonville.

Her piano teachers included a neighbor, Mr. Dietrich; Prof. Joseph Solerno, a retired conductor and composer for the US Navy Band, from Italy, who lived in Jamaica, Queens; Irma Harter at the Edith MacIntosh School of Music in Rockville Center, NY, who had studied at Fontainebleau, France, with a Cassadeseu and the famous pedagogist Isidor Phillip; Edith MacIntosh, who had studied with the famous pedagogist Mathais and was one of the first women ever to pass the American Guild of Organists' Fellowship Exam; Blanch Abram at Hofstra University; and Dr. Thomas Richner who had his doctorate from Columbia University and had several Honorary Doctorates.

A devoted Christian Scientist, Marilyn made the music for worship services in several different denominations in her 55-year career. She landed her first church organist job on Dec. 9, 1956, at the Methodist Church in Oceanside, Long Island. Although Marilyn had just turned 14, her teacher was confident she could do the job. The church was almost unheated in winter, and her mother had to drive her and sit in the cold while Marilyn practiced, learning all new music for each Sunday as well as 11 choir anthems for the Christmas service. In 1959, Marilyn became the organist at Our Saviour Lutheran Church, a big church in a suburb of Valley Stream.

During the summers of 1953, 1954 and 1955, she attended Pinecrest Dunes Camp for Boys in Peconic, Long Island, where her mother worked in the camp kitchen. Gregory, her future husband, was bugler and played cornet duets with her for the camp.

After graduating from Hofstra University in Hempstead, NY, in 1964, Greg, by then a partner in the Pinecrest Dunes camp business and associate director, hired Marilyn as camp music director and a romance blossomed. They were married the following Feb. 20, 1965.

Marilyn worked as a public school elementary music teacher from 1964 to 1969. In 1968, after Greg left the summer camp business, the couple embarked on a nine-week camping trip to Alaska, one of their many travel adventures.

After Greg retired in 1993, the couple moved to Mills River. Marilyn worked for a short time as organist for East Flat Rock United Methodist Church before getting the same job, in December 1993, at the Hendersonville Christian Science Church. She served as Dean of the Western North Carolina Chapter of the American Guild of Organists from 1997-1999. Greg and Marilyn both played in the Hendersonville Symphony for several years. In 2011, Marilyn retired as an organist except for occasional substituting at the Hendersonville Christian Science Church and Grace Lutheran Church. In 2017 Marilyn and Greg moved to Canton, GA, to be closer to their daughter Amy and her children. (Shortly afterward, she joined the Atlanta Chapter of the AGO.) Having learned German from her parents, Marilyn served as the family ambassador for relatives in Europe and enjoyed many trips abroad. Her German cousins were like brothers and sisters to her. Long before Googlemaps and armed only with a Rand McNally, Marilyn was always game to hop in the car for a drive — whether it was the road trip to Alaska, visits to national parks out west, or to take an unpaved road up the side of a mountain. Along with travel, swimming or a great meal (with dessert first) always made her smile.

In addition to her husband, Greg, Marilyn is survived by three children, Mark Munson (Melissa Feemster), Julie Beck (Doug Beck) and Amy Munson, and her grandchildren, Molly and Max Fitzsimons and Kate and Walter Beck.

Alice Bliss (January 9, 1925 - March 11, 2020)



We lost a remarkable, talented, and accomplished woman on Wednesday, March 11, 2020, when Alice Bliss slipped away peacefully in her sleep. Alice filled her 95 years on this earth with a kaleidoscopic variety of activities — she was a classroom teacher, music critic, benefactor, accomplished author, wonderful neighbor, great lover of "rescue" animals, and lasting and loyal friend.

Alice completed studies for both a Bachelor and Master of Arts at the University of Georgia, finishing both degrees at the remarkably young age of 19. She taught in a variety of schools — notably twice in Appalachia — and at many other educational institutions across the country. Alice shared her gift and love of music as the occasional music critic for the *Atlanta Journal*, and worked for a while at a radio station in Albany, GA. She loved to travel and made several

trips abroad to the UK and to New Zealand. Her memory was astonishing, and she filled many conversations with photographic details of her life, travels and adventures.


She was a longtime resident of Atlanta and returned to her home city to reside and begin a long series of novels published by Bozart Press. In most of these novels, she explored the relationship between daughter and mother, a reflection, many thought, of her long and complicated relationship with her mother, Evelyn. She shared her love and accomplishments as an organist and choir member with a long list of churches, including her most recent and home church of Holy Trinity Episcopal in Decatur, GA.


She was an entertaining and well-liked neighbor, at one time publishing a neighborhood "broadside," listing the travels, activities and accomplishments of her Gordon Avenue neighbors. She was generous to many organizations—the Nature Conservancy, the Humane Society, and Berry College.

Alice leaves us with a legacy of loyal friendship, love, and caring for so many. She will be greatly missed by all how knew her and were blessed by her many gifts and talents.


Atlanta Chamber Players with Jens Korndörfer at First Presbyterian Church
